All carpet should be installed in accordance with Australian/NZ Standards Association Carpet Installation Recommendations AS/NZ2455-2007 and any other instructions/recommendations provided by Feltex Carpets unless otherwise specified.

MAINTENANCE

Carpet should be cleaned and maintained in accordance with AS/NZS 3733/1995-1, and or as instructed by Feltex Carpets.

COLOUR VARIATION

Shade or pattern may vary from sample and between dyelots and within production runs due to normal dyelot variation but will be within recognised textile industry standards. Colour appearance can also vary depending upon type of light under which a sample is viewed and the light sources where the carpet is installed.

PERMANENT PILE REVERSAL (Shading / Puddling / Watermarking) Light can play strange tricks with carpet, making it appear from certain angles that particular areas are lighter or darker than others. Known as shading, it is due to the pressure on the pile during use, causing pile to lay in different directions resulting in light refraction and is a feature characteristic of cut pile carpets (particularly solid colour). Apart from affecting appearance, it has no detrimental effect on the performance of the carpet.

PATTERNED CARPETS

While Feltex Carpets uses the best available techniques to minimise pattern distortion during manufacture, the extensible nature of textile products means that some distortion due to shrinkage or stretch during and after manufacture is unavoidable, such that perfect pattern match cannot be guaranteed. Installation of patterned carpet will require more time, effort and skill and a competent carpet layer should be able to obtain a close pattern match in most circumstances though some irregularities may still be visible, particularly over multiple width installations. We further suggest you discuss pattern matching with your installer.

PANELLING / PHASING

An effect known as phasing can occur where carpet design includes random use of contrasting colours when at times these colours can coincide in production. Similarly in loop pile carpets, shading effects of colour patterning can appear as panelling down the length of the carpet. Both phasing and panelling are an accepted part of the design and in no way affect the carpet's performance.

SHIFT LINES

Construction of this carpet may involve the occurrence of shift lines across the width of the carpet. Colour, directional pile lay and light sources shining across the carpet may accentuate these lines in the form of shadowing. This is not a manufacturing fault and will not affect the carpet's wear or durability.
